

What are Toolbox Talks and how often should they be scheduled?



Toolbox Talks are important safety meetings because workers need to be trained to recognize and avoid unsafe working conditions. Toolbox Talks should be scheduled as needed, depending on the level of risks faced on the job, and levels of experience of the workers. Management should assess how often Toolbox Talks should be held in your company. Using common sense is only part of the solution in preventing injuries or accidents.

A **Toolbox Talk** is a casual team safety meeting that can be held anytime, anywhere, with any team or crew to discuss a specific safety hazard and safe work practices. They are typically led by the crew foreman or supervisor, but anyone from the crew can lead, including the company owner. Although the idea behind toolbox talks started with the construction trade, ALL companies should be having Toolbox Talks (even if they're called something else, like Safety Time-Outs, Safety Meetings or Safety Moments).





Selecting Safety and Health Topics:

Think of timely and relevant topics when selecting a meeting topic. You wouldn't want to present "Dressing for Winter Work" at the start of summer. "Heat-Related Illness" is more appropriate then. Failure to select an appropriate topic to present will result in uninterested workers, a waste of everyone's time and a loss of credibility on the part of your company's management.
